POLKA dots in every colour and size are a sure bet in the fashion stakes this spring racing season.

Fashion experts are gushing about the range of dresses — on any budget — starring the classic spot pattern.

"Spring racing outfits this season are loads of fun with plenty of colour," says online retailer Rebecca Lau, whose store GOHICelebrity.com.au has dressed celebrities including model Lara Bingle and television presenter Sonia Kruger.

"This is the time when you're allowed to clash colours, and polka dots always add femininity with a touch of fun."

Cina Stylists director Cindy Newstead co-ordinated this story's fashion shoot, which features model Susan L'Heureux wearing a My Beauty cream with navy spot dress (\$389), Talk of the Town clutch bag (\$129). Quietly Judging You navy top (\$389), with attached hot pink flower bomb (\$69), and Play house navy shoes (\$289). All items are from the Alannah Hill boutique at Chadstone Shopping Centre.

"Big trends in spring racing fashion this year include black colours, spots and stripes, bold prints, graphic prints, soft florals in brights and nudes and navy is definitely the season's 'black' in almost everything," cino Stylist Newstead says.

Look good for under \$100

Newstead recommends a woman with \$100 to spend on

her entire racing outfit looks at fashion shop Forever New or considers revamping an existing dress with some new accessories.

"If you have a plain block-colour dress, for example, red, bring in some coloured accessories to give the outfit a completely new look," she says.

"Try adding new shoes and matching hat and belt to jazz up a simple dress."

The must-have track accessory

A statement bag will rejuvenate any outfit, Newstead says. Try a bag in tan, mustard or a bright pop colour if feeling adventurous.

"Definitely invest in a great bag; a good-quality bag will make jeans and a T-shirt look great and add wow to an outfit."

Avoid racegoer fashion crimes

"As a stylist, I always recommend comfortable shoes as there is nothing worse than bare feet at the races to turn an elegant look into trashy," Newstead warns.

She says wedges are an excellent option this season and are available in a range of colours.

"Or try a platform, but wear your new shoes around the house well before the big day and/or have them stretched if they are uncomfortable," she says.

Another consideration is having a fashion "back-up plan" should the weather not cooperate.

"If the weather turns cold, do you have a blazer you can wear over the top of your dress, and can a belt be worn over the blazer to style it up?"
